REQUIREMENTS FOR A FULL-TEXT PAPER

The main body of the paper (without an abstract, acknowledgements, appendices, and references) should contain at least **16,500** characters without spaces.

Typical paper structure:

- 1) Title;
- 2) Authors;
- 3) Affiliation;
- 4) Abstract (brief statement of the purpose of the research, the principal results, and major conclusions, 100-200 words);
- 5) Keywords;
- 6) Introduction (statement of the problem and its connection with important scientific or practical tasks, analysis of recent research sources and publications where the solution to this problem is initiated, highlighting previously unsolved parts of the general problem, to which this paper is devoted; the goal and tasks of the study; paper structure);
- 7) Materials and methods (description of the main theoretical material with explanation of scientific results. Provide sufficient details to allow the work to be reproduced by an independent researcher);
- 8) Experiments (general scheme of experiments, equipment used, initial data);
- 9) Results (experimental data or theoretical results. Results should be clear and concise);
- 10) Discussion (analysis, interpretation, and evaluation of the significance of the results);
- 11) Conclusions (the most important scientific and practical results, recommendations on the scientific and practical use of the results);
- 12) Acknowledgements;
- 13) Appendices;
- 14) References.
